Reading Choral Society Bids Farewell to Music Director, Peter Hopkins, and Welcomes Graham Bier as the Interim Director

In early December, Peter Hopkins announced his resignation from Reading Choral Society as the RCS Music Director. Peter has accepted the position as the Director of Music at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church in Richmond Virginia, with his new role beginning in February. St. Stephen's is one of the largest Episcopal Churches in the US.

Peter had been the RCS Music Director since 2007. Under his leadership, Reading Choral Society has grown musically. During his seven years, he led RCS in more than thirty performances at fourteen different venues throughout Berks county. He will be greatly missed by members of RCS, and we all wish him great success with his new church position in Richmond.





Reading Choral Society welcomed Graham Bier as the Interim Director in early January. Before Peter's departure, the two directors were able to share rehearsals and work together in a smooth transition between music leadership.

Graham is the Director of Music at Bryn Athyn Cathedral as well as a lecturer in music the Bryn Athyn College. He sings regularly in the Philadelphia area as a freelance bassbaritone, with such ensembles as The Crossing and Les Canards Chantants.

He attended Oberlin Conservatory of Music as an undergraduate, holds an MA from the University of York (UK) in ensemble singing, and is in the final stages of fulfilling requirements for a PhD at the same institution. In addition to his course of study at Oberlin and the University of York, Graham studied conducting with Daniel Moe, Joseph Cullen, Adrian Lucas, and the eminent Chinese conductor Zhū Bù Xī. As Assistant Director of the elite academic chamber choir "The 24" for four years, Graham directed a wide range of choral music in concerts throughout England and China, produced a recording of new compositions, and a live BBC Radio broadcast from York Minster. Graham also served as Conductor of the University of York Concert Orchestra, Music Director of the Soon Amore Chamber Singers (UK) the Bulmer Choir (UK), and Assistant Chorusmaster of the Anna Maria Island Chorus and Orchestra (FL) among other ensembles, I Fagiolini, the Yorkshire Baroque Soloists and the Ebor Singers.






Concert season is underwritten in part by grants from the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts and the Reading Musical Foundation.

Reading Choral Society receives state arts funding support through a grant from the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, a state agency, funded by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency.

Founded in 1875, the Reading Choral Society is one of America's oldest musical ensembles, and from its earliest days has pursued performances characterized by vocal excellence and musical distinction. Under its current director, Graham Bier (the twelfth person to hold this position), approximately 65 dedicated semi-professional singers perform in the RCS. Through the RCS performances, the members enrich and enliven the musical life of the greater Reading community and the surrounding counties.



Did you know:

RCS first performed the Brahms Requiem in 1924. This will be Reading Choral Society's seventh performance of the Requiem.

Brahms was ruthless about his own music, destroying scores that he felt were not his best even late in his career, along with all his sketches.

Brahms was famous for his large beard and portly appearance, but he was guite thin as a youth, with baby-smooth cheeks, and didn't grow his beard until he was 45.


